- 1) The <u>Seattle Urban Forestry Commission</u> is recruiting for a Wildlife Biologist for Position #1. Get a fellow tree-lover in there!
- 2) As Annie Thoe of <u>Seattle Treekeepers Alliance</u> aptly reminded us a few days ago the next big event is the <u>Seattle City Council Neighborhood and Land Use Committee meeting</u> on Wed, Feb 12 at 930am. This is a critical meeting to attend given trees are centrally on the agenda and won't be again until a much later meeting in May. Please attend and raise the roof for trees!
- 3) Keep going to the **Don't Clearcut Seattle** website and click <u>Take Action</u> keep submitting comments to the Mayor and City Council! if you see something, say something. If you are worried about trees in your neighborhood or near a friend's house, near a park, school or business district say something. **Every**. Tree. Matters.
