Updates: Seattle MHA still proceeding, mostly tree-ignoring

While the City still proceeds forward with only token attention to tree protection, besides the current appeal still ongoing from the Queen Anne group, **TreePAC** is **filing an intervention as well**. Stay tuned, and hopefully someone in City Hall will actually LISTEN – but currently they are filing in opposition to us – big surprise.

This SeaTimes letter from last March arguably sums it all up:

"....Now older, affordable multifamily dwellings with parking **and trees** are being torn down and replaced by **expensive town houses and row houses that fill entire lots**. Under the MHA, lot setbacks will be even less, building heights even higher, and **no adequate provisions made for parking, tree canopy and habitat**, or neighborhood involvement...."

We still strongly urge supporters to keep up the pressure the Mayor's office and the City Council on a regular basis to demand they finally enact a strong tree protection ordinance and enforce it!
