Announcement:

Coalition for a Stronger Tree Ordinance Campaign Planning Meeting Updating Seattle's Tree Protection Ordinance in 2019

Saturday August 10, 2019 11:15 AM to 1:15 PM Green Lake Library, 7364 East Green Lake Dr N, Seattle, WA 98115

Progress continues in the campaign to update Seattle's Tree Protection Ordinance this year. On Tuesday July 30, 5 members of the Seattle Urban Forestry Commission met with Deputy Mayor David Moseley and several of the Mayor's staff. Agreement was reached with the Mayor's office to direct OSE and DCI staff to coordinate with Councilmember Sally Bagshaw and Seattle City Council staff to review the Urban Forestry Commission's revised draft of the Tree Protection Ordinance update. They will also seek out more public review and shoot for release of a final draft to be adopted by the Council the first two weeks of December.

If we continue to let the Council and Mayor know that the people in Seattle urgently want a stronger tree ordinance that works, we can make it happen! But there is still a lot of work to be done. To be most effective, we need to coordinate our efforts so that we speak and work in unison.

Join us at our meeting Sat. August 10th to discuss what we need to do next to be successful. One of the steps being considered is the formation of a larger coordinated steering committee. We also need more input to the Council and Mayor as well as broaden our coalition.

The Coalition has recently been working with a new group, the **Neighborhood Treekeepers** in Victory Heights who, with TreePAC and Friends of Seattle's Urban Forest, have started a yard sign campaign as well as a new website and Facebook page. Join us on Saturday to learn more and help.

The first 5 pages of the UFC draft ordinance linked here are an outline of its contents, followed by the actual provisions:

Draft UFC revision to Council D7 draft - Tree Regulations: <u>Tree and Urban Forest Protection and Land Use Regulations</u> So as always, we offer the 'what can I do' - but it's more diverse than before, with a lot of different things going on and different possibilities.
