#### Latest: No time like the present to Protect Seattle Trees!

Whether you have been working on this issue for some time or are new – there's a lot going on and many ways you can help! It may be a cliché, but there is truly **no time like the present** to help Seattle trees! Within the 'how can I help?' list below, there are a few immediate tasks to DEFINITELY do:

a) Go to the **Don't Clearcut Seattle** website (noted immediately below) and click Take Action – submit comments ASAP to the Mayor and City Council;

b) Join the Neighborhood Treekeepers at the <u>Seattle Climate March</u> on Friday morning Sept 20th— bring signs to SAVE OUR TREES.

c) Look through the City Council debate/times list in (5) below, register and show up/submit Tree Questions to get candidates on record as supporting trees!

d) Click through to read (and then comment on via Don't Clearcut Seattle's Take Action link the latest upcoming resolution regarding the Tree Ordinance – don't believe the name - they are passing the buck likely until NEXT YEAR, again!?

Res 31902: <u>A RESOLUTION declaring the City Council's and the Mayor's intent to</u> <u>consider strategies to protect trees and increase Seattle's tree canopy cover.</u>

How can I help? Read below and act!

1) **Join a local group** – besides <u>TreePAC</u> and <u>Friends of Seattle's Urban Forest</u>, some great new groups have started up in the past few months:

<u>The Last 6,000</u>, sponsored by *Plant Amnesty*, is a civic campaign to locate Seattle's remaining majestic trees. Have you located a <u>majestic</u> tree, (or several?) in your neighborhood or around the city? Share them with the campaign, and they will count and map them! Google and email input forms on their website at the above link (scroll to bottom 3rd of the page).
